

Why Did Jesus Fold the Napkin?

The Gospel of John tells us that the napkin, which was placed over the face of Jesus, was not just thrown aside like the grave clothes. The Bible takes an entire verse to tell us that the napkin was neatly folded, and was placed separate from the grave clothes

"Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put Him!"

"So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. Then Simon Peter, who was behind him, arrived and went into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, as well as the burial cloth (napkin) that had been around Jesus' head. **The cloth was folded up by itself, separate from the linen**." John 20:1-7

Is That important? Absolutely!

Is it significant? Yes!

In order to understand the significance of the folded napkin, you have to understand a little bit about Hebrew tradition of that day. The folded napkin had to do with the Master and Servant, and every Jewish boy knew this tradition. When the servant set the dinner table for the master, he made sure that it was exactly the way the master wanted it. The table was furnished perfectly, and then the servant would wait, just out of sight, until the master had finished eating, and the servant would not dare touch that table, until the master was finished. Now as the master was done eating, he would rise from the table, wipe his fingers, his mouth, and clean his beard, and would wad up that napkin and toss it onto the table. The servant would then know to clear the table. For in those days, the wadded napkin meant, "I'm done." But, if the master got up from the table, folded his napkin and then laid it beside his plate, the servant would not dare touch the table, because. . .the folded napkin meant, "I'm coming back!"

Jesus is coming back!!!




Children's and Adult Sunday School 10:00am All Are Welcome

The NALC is Growing!




THE NORTH AMERICAN LUTHERAN CHURCH IS NOW


500 congregations strong! When the NALC was formed in 2010, it began with 17 charter congregations. This month, The NALC grew to 500 congregations!
